Additional Notes

A total of 240 ECTS credits of courses are required to graduate. The Economics Department students must complete elective courses to provide a total of 240 ECTS credits. Otherwise they will not be deemed to fulfil the conditions to graduate from the program.

## Important Information about the Elective Courses

The students of Economics department must take 12 technical elective courses to graduate.
These courses must be selected from the Technical Elective Courses list. Courses that are not in this list cannot be accepted as technical electives.

ECTS credits of elective courses should be equal or greater than the credits specified in the curriculum.

Important Information about the Non-technical Electives
The students of Computer Engineering department must take 3 non-technical elective courses to graduate. These can be selected from the General Elective Courses (courses with GEC codes) or Generated Common Elective (courses with GCE codes), which are offered by the Common Courses Coordination Unit (odk.neu.edu.tr). The list of these courses are updated every semester.

ECTS credits of GEC/GCE courses should be equal or greater than the credits specified in the curriculum.

* The Computer Engineering students must ensure that while selecting a new technical, GEC or GCE elective course, it should not be the same, similar or less comprehensive as any course you have previously taken in your curriculum or any compulsory course in your curriculum that you have not taken yet. In this case, the courses you have taken will not be counted as any elective courses and will not fulfill any qualifications in the curriculum.
